Rev. Nelson encouraged Second Baptist Church leadership to develop its own New Membership Orientation Manual which was completed in January 2016. Second Baptist Church began its Social Media ministry first with our online streaming of morning services in August 2015. Second Baptist Church then installed video screens in the sanctuary to enhance the worship service experience in 2017. After two years of service, Second Baptist Church decided to move in a different direction as Rev. Nelson's tenure ended on April 1, 2018. Each time we had faced a crisis, God allowed Rev. Karlous U. Kalu to step in to shoulder the mantle and guide the church, and this time was no different.

Second Baptist had been praying and listening for guidance of the Holy Spirit to call its tenth Pastor. This call was answered on March 1, 2020, by Rev. Joe L. Callahan, Jr. from St. John Baptist Church in Clovis, New Mexico.
